



A community conversation using Thought Exchange is an open dialogue. It is different from the surveys done in previous years by hired professionals using a representative sample of our community.



Why Host a Community Conversation?

- → Keep a **continuous dialogue and feedback** loop with the community.
- → Define areas of growth and improvement that can be implemented alongside district vision, mission and overall priorities.
- → Continue to **build trust** and an environment with **open lines of communication**.
- → Continue to **collect longitudinal data** and also review against PDK poll of local public school ratings*.

Survey History

The District had planned to conduct surveys in 2019, 2020, 2021 and then periodically in future years.

 - Separate staff and student engagement efforts are conducted throughout the year.






Format & Period

 In 2023, the goal was much more focused on overall growth and improvement, which lent itself to a combination of open-ended and closed-ended questions via ThoughtExchange.

ThoughtExchange Period: May 17 June 2, 2023

Format:

- One open-ended question
- 20 close-ended survey questions
 - Combination of questions that were previously asked and new questions

OW Explore

- **265** additional respondents with thoughts than the 2021 survey.
 - 525 (or an additional 260) participants that were engaged in the Exchange than the previous year's survey (answered some/all survey questions, potentially shared feedback, ranked some thoughts).
- A ratings ratio of 15 or greater shows **strong engagement**.
- Low alignment is to be expected on a first mass community Exchange.
- 1% participated using the **Spanish** translation feature.







2021




72% of respondents gave A and B grades, which is 24% higher than the previous survey period. 2022 PDK data (next slide) = 54% of an A/B grade.

Only 5% gave a D or F grade, compared to 7% in the previous period.

Only 4% chose not to respond, compared to the 31% in the previous period.

2022 PDK Comparison




54th Annual PDK Poll

"Local Public School Ratings Rise, Even as the Teaching Profession Loses Ground."

- Was conducted June 17-25, 2022, in English and Spanish, among a random national sample of 1,008 adults via the probability-based Ipsos KnowledgePanel®.
 - Data was weighted via iterative proportional fitting to benchmarks for sex, age, race/ethnicity, region, education and household income from the U.S. Census Bureau's March 2021 Current Population Survey.
 - Results have a margin of sampling error of 3.3
 points for the full sample, including design
 effects. Error margins are larger for subgroups,
 including 7.6 points for the sample of 179
 public school parents.

2022 PDK Comparison




- 54% of all adults give an A or B grade to the public schools in their community, the highest percentage numerically in PDK polls since 1974, up 10 points since the question was last asked in 2019.
 - The previous high was 53% in 2013; the long-term average, 44%.





- The boost in confidence in public schools in PDK data occurred among non-parents only; among K-12 public school parents, ratings of the local public schools are down 6 points from three years ago, although that's not a statistically significant change given sample sizes.
 - On another measure, public school parents are slightly less apt to give their own child's school an A or B grade than in 2019, 68% vs. 75%.

Reason for Grade





Student support and student performance were added to the 2023 question. Student behavior was removed from the 2023 survey. **Student support received the most responses at 24%.**

Quality of instruction as a reason went down 9% from the previous period.

Financial management as a reason also went down 9% from the previous period. Leadership and management responses went down from the previous period and reasons were allocated to other areas.


A larger portion of respondents chose "other" (6% more) than the previous period.



Given the format of survey, some respondents used the "other" selection to provide general feedback or comments not 100% directly related to the survey question. This is a very normal behavior and to be expected with the first district-wide ThoughtExchange.







41% of respondents gave A and B grades, which is roughly 14% higher than the previous survey period.

Only 12% gave a D or F grade, compared to roughly 45% in the previous period.

School Board Grade







Only 24% of respondents felt they were unsure about providing a grade vs. the 46% that did not provide an answer in the previous period.

50% of respondents gave A and B grades, which is roughly 27% higher than the previous survey period
Only 10% gave a D or F grade, compared to roughly 17% in the previous period.

School Board Grade Trends - Last 12 Months







Roughly the same percentage of respondents in the 2023 Exchange and 2021 survey (23%) shared that there was improvement in the last 12 months of the survey period.

5% less respondents felt that performance got worse.

More 2023 respondents (18% vs. 2%) noted that they were unsure.

Superintendent Grade






53% of respondents gave A and B grades, which is 23% higher than the previous survey period

Roughly 60% of the 2021 respondents chose not to answer this question compared to 25% in the present Exchange (2023).

Superintendent Grade Trend - Last 12 Months



In 2021, there was a greater shift in the grade being better than the previous 12 month period (25% compared to 10% in the 2023 survey period).


The percentages associated with grades staying the same, being worse or the respondent noting "unsure" has stayed roughly the same in 2023 compared to the 2021 survey period.

Quality of Education




2021 Comparison:

41% stated that Shakopee provided a higher quality of education than neighboring districts compared to 23% in 2021.

A relatively comparable percentage (16% - 2023 to 13% - 2021) feel the quality of education is not as good.

Quality of Teachers



2021 Comparison:

49% said Shakopee provided higher quality teachers than neighboring districts compared to 23% in 2021.

A relatively comparable percentage felt the quality of teachers is comparable or not as good as other districts from the 2021 to 2023.



In comparison with neighboring public school districts, how would you describe the competitiveness of afterschool activities and athletics offered by Shakopee Public Schools?



Academies of Shakopee



2021 Comparison:

55% said the Academies of Shakopee provided real-world learning experiences and prepare students extremely well/well compared to 47% in 2021.

A relatively comparable percentage felt preparedness was not very well or not at all preparing students from the 2021 to 2023.

The percentage of respondents that were unsure went down 10% from the previous survey period.





Favorability





How does the quality of teachers rating correlate to the respondents view on education being a priority?











How does awareness of district and school news correlate to grade level?






A quick overview of the main thoughts

The responses to the asked question demonstrate a wide range of opinions and values regarding the quality of education in Shakopee. Many respondents highlighted the importance of quality teachers, diverse learning opportunities, and support for students with special needs. Others noted the need for more resources, such as increased funding for support staff, better safety measures, and more activities for middle school students. Additionally, many respondents expressed the need for more accountability and responsibility for students, as well as better English support for Thai-speaking students. Overall, the responses demonstrate a desire for quality education that meets the needs of all students.

Top Themes by Relevance

1 Teaching quality

Teaching quality is an important factor in providing quality education to students. 
5 Relationships

General Summary of Highest Rated Thoughts

Participants of a survey about Shakopee Public Schools value the teachers and staff the most, as they are the backbone of the district and interact with students daily.

They also appreciate the diversity of the student body, the character curriculum, and the academies model at the high school.

Participants expressed a need for more staff, smaller class sizes and better pay for teachers.

They also highlighted the need for more discipline and accountability, as well as career exploration opportunities and life readiness classes.

Finally, they emphasized the importance of safety and respect between teachers, students and parents.





General Summary of Lowest Rated Thoughts

Did not generate conversation/feedback

Participants in this survey expressed a variety of opinions about Shakopee Public Schools.

Those participants with the lowest rated thoughts felt that the Academies were not working, and that there should be more electives and less red tape.

Others felt that there should be more emphasis on academics and less on social emotional learning, and that the school should stay neutral in all aspects of life.

Additionally, participants with the lowest rated thoughts felt that the school should not promote special interests or groups, and that teachers should not share their political affiliations.





Common Ground & Differences - Topics Identified

- Real World Learning and Academies/Valuing Diversity
 - 125/110 respondents on each side
- Support Staff/ Valuing Diversity
 - 81/39 respondents on each side
- Education Kids/Supporting Kids
 - 145/145 respondents on each side

These are the areas we will dive deeper into on each side (A/B) in our action item review.



I value the quality teachers and support staff at my child's school. I value the opportunity my children have to be challenged in their learning. Many kids are struggling and it seems to be an opportunity for growth. Students need to learn to type earlier and have access to real keyboards. Continue to challenge them. Make them more rounded. Quality opportunities. Allows for greater and more specific advancement. This is our first year in the school district. The district has weathered controversy, Covid, and financial crisis. The district is stable and setup well for future success.



What will we do with the data? What's next?

- Share with leadership and building administrators. Continue to make improvements in critical areas such as:
 - Student learning and assessment for learning
 - Instructional leadership and overall quality of education
 - District leadership and focus
 - School board alignment and engagement
 - Equity
 - Community relations and partnerships
 - o Communications, relationship opportunities and touchpoints
 - Financial stability and performance
 - Impact within the community
- Incorporate into systems and structures, and school year efforts.
- Define additional areas in need of community input, further exploration including any untapped audience areas or topics that would benefit from additional conversation.
- Share with the community in the fall and upcoming newsletter, which will include an interactive website to review select data.
- Discuss during August 7, 2023 Board Development.
- Add to future longitudinal data collection and community engagement opportunities.
